

TAMPA CITY BALLET

Tampa City Ballet began its evolution in 2012, when Paula Nunez founded the company as a non-profit organization with the original mission of developing the outreach program "On Your Feet". It was not until 2018 that Tampa City Ballet as a company nurtured the cultural life of our community with innovative performances that are relatable to daily life.

Tampa City Ballet considers the artistic representation of cultural and racial diversity essential and focuses on cultivating such diversity as a priority of our mission in our Performances, our Educational Programming and our Employment Practices. Tampa City Ballet provides educational programming to our community by engaging with senior living facilities and home-schooled youth, as well as by presenting education as recreation to youth. We also enrich the artistic life of our community by our employment of professional dancers, choreographers, musicians, videographers, and designers. In these and other ways, Tampa City Ballet seeks to present the rich cultural diversity of the Tampa Bay area to the widest possible audience.

Tampa City Ballet's Performance Program aspires to develop new works that draw on the creative talents of contemporary choreographers and speak to the time in which they are made and the history that inspired them. During the COVID-19 pandemic, TCB's resilience was tested. Through the talents of artistic director Paula Nunez and the brilliant filmmaker Natalie Marty, 7th Avenue & Ybor-102 Degrees was produced. The short film about the cycle of life, loss, and love in 1918 Ybor City, hit hardest by the Spanish Flu, has been accepted to several prestigious national and international film festivals.

In addition, family-friendly events such as newly inspired creations of classic stories like Pulcinella, Cinderella, and The Nutcracker along with cutting-edge contemporary choreographic works such as After Image, If I Cry, and It's Been a Minute helped us to maintain our stage presence. TCB creates and stages a minimum of four unique events annually, promoted and presented to communities across Tampa Bay. Some are presented at no cost; others are ticketed events.

Tampa City Ballet's Education Program is designed to meet the needs of anyone from children to senior citizens at all levels from novice to pre-professional. In partnership with the University Area Community Development Corporation and their program "Prodigy", TCB provides instruction and offers scholarships to talented youth.

Tampa City Ballet's Community Engagement Program is designed to inspire the Tampa Bay communities with the power of dance. TCB believes dance is a social rite for all people, regardless of age, class, race, ability, or economic station. In fact, the cast of TCB's 2021 spring performance of Cinderella consisted of 60% minority dancers. Since December 2022, Tampa City Ballet has been part of the collective art space at the Historic Ybor City Kress Building in the new Gas Worx District.

Matthew Doolin

Matthew began dancing professionally in high school 15 years ago. He received his Bachelors in Dance Pedagogy from Butler University and his licensure/training in Neuromuscular Massage Therapy from the National Holistic Institute in San Francisco Bay Area.

He has taken his experiences dancing with the Orlando Ballet, Post:Ballet, and Amy Seiwert's IMAGERY, into his artistry as a teacher and therapist. He has traveled to Beijing, Montreal, Juneau, and New York City to share his passions for movement and bodywork. Most recently, he was premiered by Tulum's first International Dance Festival Genesis by Qifulness; an Interdisciplinary Holistic Center.

Matthew finds Tampa City Ballet a world class organization and has stayed committed to their growth since its beginnings in 2018. He and his dog Rudy couldn't be happier to be back!

John Paul Miecznikowski

John Paul began his dance training at the age of six training in hip hop, jazz and contemporary. At the age of 12, he performed in musical theater acts like Seussical The Musical with Patel Conservatory and began training in acting at Orange Grove Magnet Middle School.

He started training in classical ballet in 2017 at Americas' Ballet School under the leadership of Paula Nunez and Osmany Montano. This same year, he performed in the YAGP NYC Finals and won 1st place at ADC/IBC (International Ballet Competition) in all categories for the Men's JR division. With Americas' Ballet School, he performed Don Quixote (Full) Pas de Deux, Variation and Coda as Basilio, Dr. Coppelius in Coppelia, among many other classical and contemporary pas. He was trained in partnering by Ballet Master, Osmany Montano.

He joined Tampa City Ballet in 2018 and has been a part of its many performances, including "After Image", "7th Avenue and Ybor", "If I Cry", and "Carmen". He also performed The Nutcracker multiple times, as the Cavalier, Snow King, Rat King, Arabian, Spanish, and Russian dancer.



Maria Fernanda Papa

Maria Fernanda Papa started her ballet training at the age of seven at Vladimir Issaev School of Classical Ballet in Miami where she received training from Vladimir Issaev, Lisa Maltzeva, Luana Hidalgo, and Giselle Deya. She has had the opportunity to attend American Dance Competition, Universal Ballet Competition, and Miami International Ballet Competition, receiving multiple awards and scholarships.

Her repertoire includes The Nutcracker, Flames of Paris, Le Corsaire, Sleeping Beauty, Chipollino, Dr. Ouch!, Shostakovich Suites, Fairy Doll, Coppelia, Paquita, Danzon, Firebird, Stone Flower, Le Papillon, Rite of Spring, Cinderella, Carmen, amongst others. She graduated from America's Ballet School in 2021 and has since been teaching and dancing with Tampa City Ballet as well as studying for her Business Administration degree.

Vashti Walters

Vashti Walters began her dance training at the age of 13 at a recreation center in Richardson, Texas. A few months later, she began training seriously at Tuzer Ballet with Tanju and Pat Tuzer, former dancers of the Harkness Ballet, where she received many opportunities, including performing in the Nutcracker and in a Turkish folk-dancing group called Rakkas Dance led by Onur Kasaburi.

In 2016, she moved to Florida and joined Tampa Ballet Theatre as a trainee. She spent the 2017 - 2018 season as an apprentice and was promoted to the company in 2018. She enjoyed performing soloist roles in The Nutcracker, Sleeping Beauty and Swan Lake. In 2020 she moved to St. Petersburg where she performed as a guest artist for local productions.

She is currently dancing with Tampa City Ballet and teaching throughout the Tampa Bay area.





Wilson de los Santos

Wilson was born in the Dominican Republic, where he studied ballet at the Dominican Republic's National School of Dance, folklore - contemporary mention. Carissa Smith



In the summer of 2022 she danced with Dutch National Ballet Academy for their summer intensive. Within 2022 she joined Tampa City Ballet as a Trainee, where she has been taking part in various productions ranging from Candlelight to Underline to One on One.

He has performed in works by Ana Maria Lucaciu, Annie Rigney, George Balanchine, Jerome Robbins, Johannes Weiland, Jose Limón, and more.





Nicole Assaad

Nicole Assaad started dancing ballet at the age of eight at the Patel Conservatory. After a year, she moved to All American Classical Ballet School in Tampa, Florida where she received training from Julio Montano and Gisell Durand.

She won many awards and scholarships from competitions such as the Youth America Grand Prix, American Dance Competition, as a gold medalist and a recipient of the Fernando Bujones Award, and World Ballet Competition, receiving the bronze medal in the final round.

At age 15, she moved to New York City to study with the Gelsey Kirkland Academy under a full scholarship. At age 16, she joined the Gelsey Kirkland Ballet Studio Company, performing various roles, such as "Marie" and "Sugarplum" in The Nutcracker, "Columbina" in the Flames of Paris, "Kitri" in Don Quixote, Diamond and Charity fairy in the Sleeping Beauty, along with many other roles.

At age 18, she joined the Hong Kong Ballet's corps de ballet under the direction of Madeleine Onne, where she performed in many productions such as Romeo and Juliet, Coppelia, Pinnochio, Carmen, Lady of the Camellias, and many other original productions that toured in Canada, the US, Macau, and Mainland China.

Currently, she is teaching in the Tampa Bay Area and has been dancing with Tampa City Ballet since the 2020-2021 season.

Aynsleigh Morehouse

Aynsleigh Morehouse has been dancing since the age of 4 in Tampa Florida attending dance competitions, conventions, workshops, and ballet intensives all throughout the state. Through training in all styles, she discovered that her passion was in both classical and contemporary ballet work. She has obtained a BFA in ballet performance from the University of South Florida, with a minor in Entrepreneurship.

While at USF, Aynsleigh has had the opportunity to work with both faculty and student choreographers, and has performed in several concerts at USF. She has also performed in various ballet and modern works in other venues. As a choreographer Aynsleigh has presented many original pieces over the last few years in the USF Student Dance Concert, as well as in the USF Senior BFA Fall and Spring Concerts. Aynsleigh is looking forward to all of her future artistic endeavors.



ARTISTIC TEAM AND COLLABORATORS

Paula Nuñez

Paula Nuñez is a former professional principal dancer, choreographer, and current Faculty member at the University of South Florida. Nuñez trained at the Gustavo Franklin School in Caracas, Venezuela and her career began at the International Ballet of Caracas. She subsequently went on to become a celebrated principal dancer with the Ballet Nuevo Mundo de Caracas and Cleveland - San Jose Ballet. In 2002, Nuñez founded America's Ballet School and formalized "On Your Feet", a program that teaches youth creative movement to express themselves for positive youth development and appreciation of the arts.

Since establishing Tampa City Ballet in 2018, the company has been contributing to the social and cultural life in Florida. Nuñez launched seven world premieres and has collaborated with the Florida Museum of Photography, the Glazer Children's Museum, The Contemporary Art Music Project, University Area CDC, Carrollwood Cultural Center and Ybor City Community Development Area. Her contemporary version of "Pulcinella" in collaboration with the Florida Orchestra and The Museum of Fine Arts sold out all the performances at The Straz Center and Mahaffey Theater.

Nuñez received YAGP and ADC's best teacher and choreographer awards, USF's Hispanic Woman of the Year award, Best of the Bay's Best Dance Company and Choreographer award and was nominated for the City of Tampa's Hispanic Heritage Award.

Luana Hidalgo

Luana Hidalgo started studying dance at the Institute of Art at an early age and graduated from Madame Irene Levandoski's Ballet School. She became a soloist with Ballet of Maracaibo before she became a principal dancer for Ballet Nuevo Mundo de Caracas, continuing on to becoming a principal dancer with The Cleveland - San Jose Ballet. In 1995, she was awarded "Best Classical Dancer - Casa del Artista" in Venezuela and in 2001 received the honor of the "City of Avignon" in France. Hidalgo has been a dance teacher for The Cleveland - San Jose Ballet School, The Nevada Ballet Theater, Ballet San Jose and the Vladimir Issaev School of Classical Ballet. Upon her move to Tampa in 2017, Hidalgo joined the Tampa City Ballet faculty and Paula Nunez's community engagement project "On Your Feet"



Osmany Montano

Osmany Montano trained at the Escuela Nacional de Ballet in La Habana, Cuba, under the direction of Alicia Alonso, Ramona De Saa, and Magda Campo. Among his many achievements as a ballet student, he was awarded a Silver Medallion at the Cuban Ballet Festival. In Cuba, Montano danced with the Cuban National Ballet and Ballet of Santiago de Cuba, under the direction of Alicia Alonso and Maria Elena Martinez respectively, as well as Ballet of Camaguey under the direction of Fernando Alonso. He also had a distinguished career with the National Ballet of Caracas under the direction of Vicente Nebrada. Internationally, he performed in Israel, Germany, Italy, Peru, Mexico, Colombia, Trinidad and Tobago, among others. In the United States, he performed with the Tulsa Ballet and Sarasota Ballet. In 2007, he joined the faculty of America's Ballet School, and since 2012, he has been an Adjunct Dance Professor at the University of South Florida and Tampa City Ballet's Artistic Director Associate.

Bliss Kohlmyer

Bliss has danced and toured internationally with the Bill T. Jones/Arnie Zane Dance Company and the Sean Curran Company, as well as with companies in San Francisco such as Janice Garrett and Dancers, Robert Moses' Kin, and the San Francisco Opera Ballet. She received her MFA in Dance from the University of Washington in 2011. Currently she is Associate Professor of Dance at the University of South Florida, Co-Artistic Director of Project Agora, and is working on a collaborative film titled Murmurs of the River. She has collaborated with pianist Svetozar Ivanov, which was presented both nationally and internationally. Her choreographic works have been commissioned by the LINES Ballet Summer Program, Dickinson College, Florida State College, Florida Dance Festival, among others.

Sunshine Dance Group - Lisha Dong



Dancing has always been a part of Native American culture since the beginning of their creation.


They keep educating cultural and living history while performing dances and songs of modern Pow-Wows today.

Born and raised in Miami Dade-County, Mary Durant fell in love with the art/discipline of dance, at the tender age of 7. Miami's dance culture is known to cross train dancers with multiple techniques of dance. As a result, Mary received training from the Thomas Armour Dance Conservatory (ballet), New World School of the Arts (Ballet & Dance Company (Modern, Jazz, Contemporary, Hip-Hop), and Ailey Camp Miami (all above & Dance).



Carly Weinsier



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

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
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
